Guest Speaker Laura Smith Presents Skin of Venus, the Subtle Power of the Background Color



No recording of voice or video will be permitted. Handouts may not be shared or posted.

"Give me mud and I will make the skin of a Venus from it—if you allow me to surround it as I please," said the artist Eugène Delacroix (1798 - 1863). His ideas about color and design shaped both the Romantic and Impressionist movements in art. They are applied to embroidery in over fifty inspiring examples that both reveal and revel in the depth of thought and strategy that can be applied to the use of color. Each section is introduced by one of Delacroix's

dramatic works. All embroidery artists have given permission and are recognized in the talk.

Laura Smith holds the EGA Master Craftsman in Color designation and chaired the EGA Master Craftsman

in Color Program for twelve years. She is an embroidery innovator and nationally known designer. She is past Chairman of EGA Fiber Forum, former director of an arts center, and the EGA National Gold Thread Award recipient for 2021. Her website is www.Stitch4Fun.com

January 2, 2025 Introduction to Crewel Embroidery Designed by Leslie Mehard Brady



Suzanne Knepper, our own EGA Master Craftsman in Crewel Embroidery, will be teaching the basics of using this Petite Projects from the EGA website.

Log in to the EGA national website and use this link <u>https://egausa.org/app/uploads/2024/08/protected-petite-project-intro-Jacobean-crewel.pdf</u> to print or view on-line the 12-page instruction sheet.

This project is designed for confident beginners to experienced intermediates and will expose embroiderers to seven crewel embroidery stitches.

We will provide a kit with a printed copy of the design, a piece of 9"x9" tight-weave fabric and wool yarns (colors will vary from the example depending on what Suzanne can pull together from her stash).

If you would prefer the traditional linen twill, please feel free to bring your own.

You will need to provide a #22 chenille needle, a #18 or #20 tapestry needle, a 6" hoop, and your preferred method to transfer the pattern to the fabric. If you would like to duplicate the colors shown in the photo above, feel free to provide your own wool yarn. You can find the recommended Appleton yarns in the instruction sheet.

February 6th, 2025 Dorset Buttons Designed by Hope A. Wright

In February, we will try our hand at Dorset Buttons, another EGA Petite Project.

The buttons originated in the early 1600's in Dorset, England and continued to provide income to local families until the industrial revolution in the mid 1800's. They were typically made from locally sourced materials such as ram's horn rings and linen thread. We will be using metal rings (sourced from Amazon) and pearl cotton thread (sourced from our member donated supplies).

These fun little trinkets are easy and fun to make and can easily be completed at our meeting. We will be providing the metal rings and pearl cotton in various colors and sizes, but feel free to bring your own if you have a particular color scheme in mind.

Batik to Stitch, March 25-26, 2025 with Laura Smith

You are invited to join us for *Batik to Stitch*, a two-day class with Laura Smith on Tuesday, March 25 and Wednesday, March 26, 2025. We will meet from 9:00 amto 4:00 pm with a lunch break at St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic Church, 5150 N. Valley View Rd, Tucson, AZ. If you have questions, please contact Martha Hirsch.



Left: Batik sea turtle embellished with couching, seed stitches, and colonial knots. Notice the dark blue lines of the optional crackle background. The turtle tjap is 5 inches long and 4 inches wide.

Batik can create complex, stitchable designs with color layering on fabric. Wax is applied to fabric with a stamp called a tjap (pronounced "chop"). Several choices of images are offered—a turtle (shown), irises, dragonfly, butterfly, gecko, owl, sunflower, daylily, and small geometric design. Students can make two to four pieces. Colors are painted in layers alternating with more wax. An optional crackling technique gives a marbled effect seen as navy blue lines in the turtle design above. Safety measures are emphasized throughout the class.

Students learn the subtleties of the batik process on Day 1. On Day 2, they create stitch plans for their designs or make more batik images. Each student receives individual guidance for developing design elements and using subtle color concepts to unify the design. A shared class stash of threads, beads, tulle, and mixed media is available giving the full range of color options for embroidery and embellishment.

The Kit

Prepared for dyeing (PFD) cotton for up to five images Paint, brushes and non-latex gloves Hand stitching threads and needles Students will share the waxing setups, irons, ironing boards, and a Class Treasure Chest of sequins, beads, and a variety of threads for a wide range of color options.

Students to Bring

At least a one-inch stack of clean, recycled paper grocery bags, newspaper, or newsprint paper for stamping and ironing out wax. Bring usual stitching supplies, scissors for paper and for embroidery. On the first day, we'll need two fans for the whole class for drying paint. On the second day, we'll need one iron and ironing board for every five students. Tjaps (Chops) Available for the Class

Other tjaps depict a sea turtle, dragonfly, square geometric design, gecko, owl, lily, and sunflower. Each student may use as many tjaps as they wish to create batik.





Teacher Bio

Laura Smith is an embroidery innovator, nationally known designer, and teacher. She holds the Master Craftsman in Color from the Embroiderers Guild of America (EGA) and has won the Carolinas Region and National Gold Thread Awards for service in 2021. She has served as chair for the Master Craftsman in Color Program from 2006 – 2018, Chairman of Fiber Forum (2011 – 2015), seven terms as president of her chapter, and has held every chapter office. She is a former Executive Director of an arts center and holds an MBA as well as an undergraduate degree in chemistry -- valuable for understanding paint, wax, and mixed media materials.
